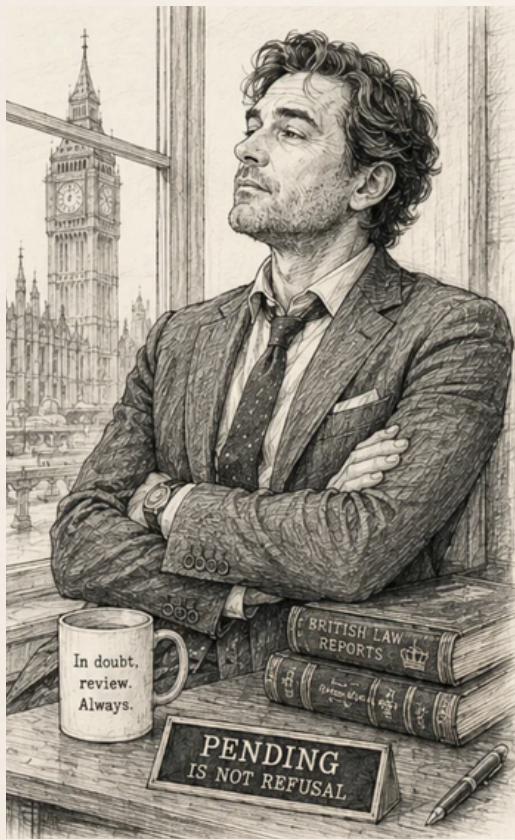


IDENTIFICATION OF THE PARTIES

Breaker of British Defence Systems



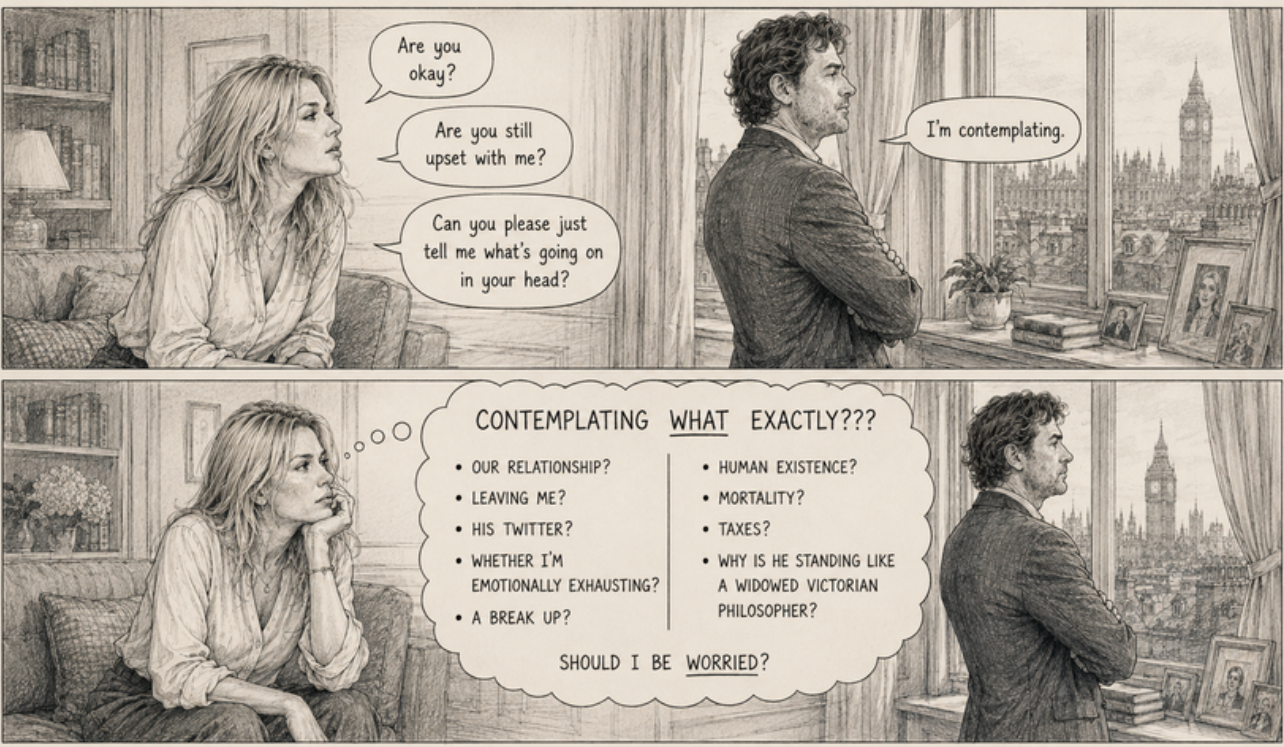
Capable of constructing seventeen plausible

**Exhibit A**  
- Initial Statement Delivered Without Supporting Documentation

Following a minor emotional incident, John issued the phrase: “I’m contemplating.”  
No clarification, timeframe, or emotional appendix was provided.

**Exhibit B**  
- Consequences of Ambiguous Terminology

The Court subsequently observed two radically different internal interpretations of the  
exact same sentence:  
-one involving emotional catastrophe,  
-the other involving quiet cognitive processing and probable tea.

**Finding of the Court :**  
The Court established that immediate mutual understanding was not achieved.
